State of emergency in Kyoto Prefecture to prevent the spread of the novel coronavirus infection (May 5th, 2020 Revision)

The state of emergency that was introduced in Kyoto Prefecture on April 17th to reduce the spread of the novel coronavirus infection will be extended.

Outline of the state of emergency in Kyoto Prefecture


- Area All of Kyoto Prefecture
- II. Period From April 17th, 2020 until May 31st, 2020.
 - The situation will be reassessed in mid-May, based upon the status of infections, medical care systems and so forth.

1 Request to refrain from going out (Special Measures Law Article 45 Paragraph 1)

- 1. As a general rule, citizens are requested not to go out of their homes unless it is necessary for their everyday lives, such as for going to medical institutions, shopping for food, or for going to work.
- 2. In particular, we strongly request that you refrain from going out to areas where the three Cs overlap; closed spaces, crowded places, and close-contact settings, such as visiting the high-street area at night.



2 Request to refrain from holding events (Special Measures Law, Article 24 Paragraph 9)

We request event organizers to refrain from holding events, regardless of the size or the location of the venue

【Contents of self restraint request】
OScale of event: Large or small events
OVenus: Both inside and outside events
OType of event/contents: All events, except those necessary for daily life
(Specific examples)
Cultural events (Concerts, performances, recitals, etc.)
Special events (Product exhibitions, exhibitions, sales promotion events, flee markets etc.), ceremonies, lectures/workshops, sports events, etc.
*However, the following events which are necessary for daily life can be carried out with proper measures taken

against the spread of infection: briefing sessions / lottery meetings for public housing, small training sessions for

businesses, etc.

3 Request for restricting the use of facilities, etc.

(1) Facilities that, in general, won't be requested to close Request for appropriate measures to prevent infection (Special Measures Law Article 24 Paragraph 9)
